2024 MEMBERS-AT-LARGE ELECTION

This position is open to any Kountry Klub member in good standing who owns a Newmar Recreational Vehicle. The candidates shall have no ownership in, or be employed with, any RV dealership. It is a three year term starting August 2, 2024.

The Members-at-Large are elected by the general membership. They are also members of the Kountry Klub Board of Directors, representing all members. Members who intend to run for this position must file with the International Directors, IN WRITING, no later than March 1, 2024 to: Duane Paige & Laurie Hunt, International Directors, Newmar Kountry Klub, PO Box 30, Nappanee, IN 46550 or by email to KlubDirectors@NewmarCorp.com.

All candidates will have the opportunity to submit a picture and an article to be published in the April and June issues of Legacy magazine, on the Klub's website and in *The Happenings* email. All candidates will also be offered the opportunity to address those attending the opening ceremonies during the International Rally. Please email article and photo to kountryklub@newmarcorp.com by March 1st to be included in the April issue. If for some reason a candidate is unable to attend the International Rally, they may designate someone to read their comments to the membership.

The voting will be done by secret ballot during the Kountry Klub Business Meeting held during the International Rally. If you do not plan on attending the International Rally, and wish to vote, you may request a ballot from the Kountry Klub office. This must be done in writing or by email. Ballots must be returned to the Klub office no later than June 28, 2024. The unopened ballots will be securely kept and taken to the International Rally where the votes will be counted by those appointed. The Members-at-Large will be determined by the candidate receiving the most votes on the first ballot.

As a member of the Board of Directors, you will be working closely with the International Directors, the Klub office staff, Region Directors and other Board Members. You should be available to travel and attend Board Meetings as necessary. You should have a good understanding of the Mission and Goals of the Newmar Kountry Klub and a good understanding of how the Klub functions. You should be a good public relations person with good oral, computer and written communication skills. You will write articles for the *Legacy* magazine. In addition, you will answer any inquiries you receive from the general membership. You are responsible for reporting membership information, ideas and concerns as well as suggested recommendations for review by the Board of Directors.

Benefits: You will be reimbursed for Klub related office expenses, Board Meeting travel and rallies and special Klub functions you attend on behalf of the Kountry Klub. You will receive a rebate on your choice of a new Newmar Recreational Vehicle, renewal of membership and *Legacy* magazine subscription while in office, title and name sign, name badges; and special recognition at all Newmar Kountry Klub functions you attend.

As is our custom the December issue recipes are from the Klub Directors and office staff. Hope you enjoy these as much as our friends and families do!

Cóctel De Camarón (Mexican Shrimp Cocktail)

Servings: Serves 4 to 6 Cook Time: 45 minutes

This recipe is modified from the original to make better suited for cooking in an RV – let's use frozen cooked peeled and deveined, tail-off shrimal

Description:

This popular Mexican dish consists of cooked shrimp tossed with chopped vegetables in a bright tomato sauce.

Cutting the shrimp into bite-size pieces made them easier to eat.

For a sauce that wasn't too sweet, we used a combination of savory V8 and ketchup plus lime juice and hot sauce. V8's slightly viscous consistency, along with the ketchup, gave the sauce body to nicely coat the shrimp.

Cucumber and red onion added crunch, avocado added creaminess, and cilantro added freshness. The balanced flavor of Valentina, Cholula, or Tapatío hot sauce works best here. If using a spicier, vinegary hot sauce such as Tabasco, start with half the amount called for and adjust to your taste after mixing.

Saltines are a traditional accompaniment, but tortilla chips or thick-cut potato chips are also good.

Serve this Mexican shrimp cocktail dish as an appetizer or light meal.

Ingredients:

- 1 ¼ pounds large shrimp (26 to 30 per pound) (peeled, deveined, and tails removed)
- 1/4 teaspoon table salt
- 1 cup V8 juice, chilled
- ½ cup ketchup
- 3 tablespoons lime juice (2 limes), plus lime wedges for serving
- 2 teaspoons hot sauce, plus extra for serving (Valentina, Cholula, or Tapatío hot sauce)
- ½ English cucumber, cut into ½-inch pieces
- 1 cup finely chopped red onion
- 1 avocado, halved, pitted, and cut into ½-inch pieces
- ¼ cup chopped fresh cilantro
- Saltines

Directions:

Cut each shrimp crosswise into 3 pieces. Combine V8 juice, ketchup, lime juice, hot sauce, and salt in medium bowl. Add cucumber, onion, and shrimp and stir until evenly coated. Stir in avocado and cilantro. Portion cocktail into individual bowls or glasses and serve immediately, passing saltines, lime wedges, and extra hot sauce separately.

Turkey Pot Pie with Stuffing Crust

Servings: Serves 6 to 8

Time: 30 minutes

This 30-minute supper is a great option for leftover turkey and stuffing.

Description:

Turkey pot pie is the perfect dish to make the day after a holiday dinner. It uses both leftover turkey and stuffing, and our Turkey Pot Pie with Stuffing Crust recipe uses just two dishes and cooks up in less than 30 minutes.

Although leftover homemade stuffing works best here, one 6-ounce box of stuffing mix, prepared according to package instructions and chilled, will suffice

For this recipe, a 12-inch oven safe skillet is the best choice.

Ingredients:

- · 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 celery rib, chopped
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
- 1 teaspoon poultry seasoning
- 1 cup frozen peas and carrots mix, thawed
- 4 cups shredded cooked turkey
- 3 cups prepared stuffing (or one 6-ounce box of stuffing mix, prepared according to package instructions and chilled)
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten

Directions:

Adjust oven rack to upper-middle position and heat oven to 475 degrees.

Melt butter in large oven-safe skillet over medium-high heat. Cook onion and celery until soft, about 4 minutes.

Stir in flour and cook until lightly browned, about 1 minute.

Slowly whisk in broth and cream and simmer until thickened, 5 to 7 minutes.

Add peas and carrots mix and turkey and cook until heated through, about 2 minutes.

Meanwhile, combine stuffing and egg in large bowl.

Place stuffing mixture between pieces of parchment paper and roll into 11-inch circle. Remove top layer of parchment and cut into 6 wedges.

Arrange wedges evenly over filling and bake until stuffing is golden brown and crisp, about 12 minutes. Serve.

Easy Cinnamon Apples

Ingredients:

- 6 apples cored and chopped (about 6 cups with or without the peel)
- · 4 TBS water
- 2 TBS salted butter (or coconut oil)
- 2 TBS maple syrup
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp fine sea salt
- 1/2 tsp pure vanilla extract

Directions:

Cut apples into same-sized pieces (about $\frac{1}{2}$ -1" cubes) I usually clean but do not peel – your choice.

Put apples pieces into a skillet with 4T water. Cover the pan and cook over medium heat for about 5 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the apples become slightly soft and water is absorbed.

Add 2T butter to the skillet. Stir apples until coated with melted butter. Cook for 5 minutes, stirring every minute or so, until the apples become soft (you may need to cover them for the last 2 minutes).

Add Maple syrup, cinnamon, salt and vanilla. Stir until well mixed.

Cook for about 5 more minutes, stirring every minute until the apples reach your desired softness!

Remove from heat and serve!

Note can be used as a topping to pancakes, oatmeal or even vanilla ice cream!

Sweet Potato Brownies with Vegan Dairy Free Dark Chocolate Avocado Frosting

ngredients:

- 1.5 cups baked sweet potato mash
- 1 cup cashew butter or a nut butter of your choosing
- 3 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/4 cup maple syrup or another sweetener (like date paste)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- (Optional: 1 or 2 eggs)

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- 2. Poke sweet potatoes with a fork and bake for 1 hour. You can cook the sweet potatoes a day before if you like.
- 3. Mix the cooked sweet potatoes in a mixing bowl along with the rest of the ingredients.
- 4. Line an 8 x 8 pan with parchment paper or grease the pan.
- Pour brownie batter in your baking dish.
- 6. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes.
- 7. Remove brownies and let cool.
- 8. (Optional: Frost with Frosting Recipe Below)

Frosting Ingredients:

- 2 ripe avocados med/large, peeled and pitted
- ½ cup unsweetened dark cocoa powder
- ½ cup maple syrup
- 2 Tbsp coconut oil (melted coconut oil will give you a silkier texture, but un-melted works okay too.
- ½ tsp pure vanilla extract
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon (optional)

Instructions:

- Add avocado to a food processor fitted with an S blade and blend until smooth.
- Add remaining ingredients and blend again until smooth. You may need to stop and scrape the sides with a spatula a couple of times. (Add the maple syrup on top of the cocoa powder to keep the dust down.)
- 3. Use immediately or store in fridge until ready to use. Frosting should be okay in the fridge for a couple of days. Recipe makes about 2 cups of frosting.

After a day of troubleshooting, calls to near and far Newmar dealers, and Silverleaf, we confirmed our inverter / charger was dead.

Holy cow and horse flies! We were scheduled to join the Newmar Carvan at the Calgary Stampede in two days as well as numerous

other stops that were already reserved in Canada. It was time to decide if we could go ahead with our all electric 2020 New Aire or if we needed to cancel the trip and head for home.

Hoorah! The macerator toilet flushed! Lighting also worked on house batteries but not the refrigerator. Ice might keep it cool but that was not a long-term solution. We discovered the electrical outlets did not have power (one exception) without a working inverter and the extended window awning would not retract.

What to do? A call to Girard confirmed that the awning did not have a mechanical bypass. Solution, remove the cover, roll up the awning and fasten with extra-long zip ties. Now, where do you store an 11ft awning cover? After trying several positions in various bays, we finally found a place on the roof where it could be fastened with our long zip ties. It was still there when we arrived home!

So, we continued our trip into Canada and didn't really suffer the rest of our journey. A mobile tech in Calgary moved the refrigerator power cord from the inverter sub-panel to the shore power panel. The frig was back in business when plugged into shore power or with the generator. The solar panels we added a couple years ago kept our house batteries adequately charged. And we discovered one outlet in the back closet had shore power. A trip to the local hardware store for extension cords put us (mostly) back in business. We ran one short extension cord (with multiple sockets) behind the washer & dryer and then connected two longer cords that ran along the top of the cabinets to the dinette. Our induction cooktop worked with shore power but one of the extension cords was needed to connect the microwave. The other cord connected to a multiple outlet box used to charge phones, watches, computers, hearing aids, etc. We became efficient at storing and replacing cords each time we moved to a new RV park.

We arrived home months later with a better understanding of our coach's power system. Our favorite Newmar dealer replaced the inverter, returned wiring to the proper location, and re-installed the awning cover. All is good again.

We are now actively planning our chapter rally coming up in April. It will be at the Voyager RV Resort in Tucson. Please look for the details on the Klub Calendar.

This RV resort is only about 20 miles from Rocky Mountain National Park and September is the start of the rut season in the park. At this time of the year, you might decide to search out the elk bugling in the early evenings. You might also likely plan an activity up toward the quaint western town of Grand Lake. As long as the snow stays away, a drive over Trail Ridge Road could be a side trip you might enjoy. Of course, at over 12,000 ft. in elevation, it is one you will only want to take in your tow vehicle! A 48-mile drive over this road will take you to the tourist town of Estes Park. On the other hand, the visitor center at the western entrance to Rocky Mountain National Park is a nice place to visit (without having to drive over the Trail Ridge Road) and it features a small store and museum with lots of information about the area and this center is close to the town of Grand Lake.

We are excited to be showing off our beautiful mountain communities so keep an eye out for this event on the Klub Calendar. You will definitely want to bring along a jacket and a sweatshirt for this rally! The temperatures can dip down into the 40's in the evenings, but the air is so crisp and clean and delightfully "Colorado"!

You might want to consider joining one of our events. Of course, be sure to mark your calendars for the NKK International to be held in Pueblo, Colorado next year. We will hope to see lots of our Newmar friends there!



OASIS HYDRONIC HEATING SYSTEM OVERVIEW

This article provides basic operating instructions for the Oasis Hydronic Heating system.

For your comfort, your coach may be equipped with the Oasis heating system. This system uses a boiler and a pump to heat and recirculate hot fluid through a series of convectors placed strategically throughout your coach. Fans located on the convectors provide circulation of the warmed air for even, efficient heating.

A IMPORTANT

These brief operation instructions are for quick reference only. Any quick start instructions provided should not take the place of the complete Operation Manual provided by this item's manufacturer. More information about the Oasis system is also available on product/component pages and other articles in Newgle.

HOW HYDRONIC HEATING WORKS

Hydronic central heating is the use of a heat generator commonly called a boiler (or furnace) to raise the temperature of a heating medium, generally water or water and glycol mixture. The heated fluid is then circulated from the boiler through pipes to heat emitters such as passive radiators, convectors, and underfloor heating coils, through the interior of the motorhome, and domestic hot water heat exchanger. The fluid loses its heat through this circulation and the cooler fluid then returns to the boiler for reheating.



Never attempt to modify this furnace. Fire, explosion, asphyxiation, or carbon monoxide poisoning may occur. If the furnace malfunctions, consult a trained service technician.

The Oasis system uses two different sources for heat. The primary heat source for the Oasis system, and most efficient, is the diesel burner, which uses diesel fuel from the fuel tank to burn and create heat. The output of the diesel burner is 50,000 BTU's. Select double shower floorplans may be equipped with the 85,000 BTU model.

The second heat source is an electric heating element. It is important to note the difference between the two systems. The electric heating elements have two 5,000 BTU heating elements and should be used only to help maintain the temperature once the diesel burner has brought the system up to proper operating heat levels. From a cold start, the 5,000 watt electrical heating elements will not operate the system alone.

OPERATION

Pressing the Elec 1 (AC 1 Element) and/or Elec 2 (AC 2 Element) ON/OFF button from the appropriate control panel (Oasis control panel, KIB touch panel, or SilverLeaf touchscreen display) will turn them on or off. Pressing the Burner ON/OFF button will turn the diesel burner on or off. For the most heat and hot water capability, Newmar recommends turning on both electric elements and the diesel burner.



For more information relating to Oasis hydronic heating operation, please refer to the appropriate product pages and/or knowledge articles in Newgle. Systems may include (but are not limited to) the Oasis Control Panel, Dometic thermostats, KIB touch panels, and/or SilverLeaf touchscreens.

Note: On coaches without SilverLeaf, the Oasis controls are only available via the KIB touch panel on 2024 and newer coaches. Previous model years may be equipped with an Oasis switch in an overhead cabinet.







OASIS ZONES

For heating, your coach is divided into three "zones" on your thermostat or your climate screen, if your coach is equipped with the SilverLeaf or KIB system. The "Furnace" mode will appear in all four zones, but only three are active.

ZONE 1 - DASH, LIVING ROOM, AND KITCHEN CONVECTORS

These convectors are located under the dash and kitchen cabinets, and control heat in the cockpit, living room, and kitchen areas. The dash-mounted convector is the only one in your coach that has a two-speed fan. The switch controlling the fan speed is located in the front overhead cabinet adjacent to the diesel boiler switch.

ZONE 2 - MIDDLE AC AND HEAT PUMP

ZONE 3 - BATHROOM CONVECTORS

These convectors are located in the bathroom cabinetry and stool room. The fan switch for the stool room (marked "HEAT") must be in the "ON" position to provide heat in the stool room. In order to receive heat in the Stool Room, a "rear" zone (bathroom or bedroom areas) must be chosen on your thermostat or your climate screen, if your coach is equipped with the SilverLeaf or KIB system.

ZONE 4 - BEDROOM CONVECTORS

These convectors are located throughout the cabinetry and walls of the rear bedroom area. To activate the Oasis heating system, select your heat source, either diesel or electric, using the switches in the front overhead cabinet or through the SilverLeaf or KIB system. Once you have selected a heat source (diesel or electric), and the boiler is operational, set the thermostat for the desired zones.

A IMPORTANT

The Oasis 'diesel burner' heat source provides approximately 50,000 BTU's of heat, and is designed to start and operate the system at full capacity. The electrical heating element provides approximately 5,000 BTU's of heat.

The system will turn convector fans off and on according to the temperature settings.

BASEMENT HEAT CONVECTOR(S)

Coaches with Oasis Hydronic Heating will have a heat exchanger, dual fans, and a designated thermostat. The basement heat is activated by a separate fixed thermostat in the basement area when the compartment temperature falls below approximately 40 degrees Fahrenheit. If this happens, the hot antifreeze solution in the Oasis system will circulate, and the blower will turn on to supply heat in the basement/water compartment area. The Oasis system must be turned on and the fluid must be above the low temperature cutout for heat output.





Set the thermostat zones on "Furnace" mode, and adjust each interior zone temperature setting as desired. The separate Oasis System must be turned on via the Oasis control panel, SilverLeaf touchscreen, or KIB touch panel (2024 and newer coaches), and the water temperature in the Oasis System must be up to temperature for the basement heat to

Note: The basement heat only works when the furnace (Oasis System) is activated. It will NOT function if the Oasis System is off and the coach is being heated via the roof air conditioner heat pumps.



DOMESTIC HOT WATER

For information regarding domestic hot water via Oasis hydronic heating, refer to Newgle.

RESETTING THE OASIS SYSTEM



IMPORTANT

In the event of a fault in the Oasis system, the system will need to be reset.

To reset the Oasis system, press the exterior reset button on the face of the Oasis, or turn the burner switch off, then back on inside the coach. The reset will clear faults such as Low Voltage, Flame Out, or a Low Fluid Level switch fault, which typically clears on its own when the fluid level becomes sufficient. The Oasis will try to start twice when there is a Flame Out fault. When it fails to start the second time, it will then display a fault on the face of the Oasis and on the System Diagnostics screen within the SilverLeaf system (if equipped).



A IMPORTANT

The exterior reset or the cycling of the ON/OFF button inside the coach will not reset the system if there is a component fault, like a pump or other internal issues.



Any faults not resettable by cycling the switch or by the Oasis reset button should be diagnosed and repaired by a qualified technician.




