2024 MEMBERS-AT-LARGE ELECTION

This position is open to any Kountry Klub member in good standing who owns a Newmar Recreational Vehicle. The candidates shall have no ownership in, or be employed with, any RV dealership. It is a three year term starting August 2, 2024.

The Members-at-Large are elected by the general membership. They are also members of the Kountry Klub Board of Directors, representing all members. Members who intend to run for this position must file with the International Directors, IN WRITING, no later than March 1, 2024 to: Duane Paige & Laurie Hunt, International Directors, Newmar Kountry Klub, PO Box 30, Nappanee, IN 46550 or by email to KlubDirectors@NewmarCorp.com.

All candidates will have the opportunity to submit a picture and an article to be published in the April and June issues of Legacy magazine, on the Klub's website and in *The Happenings* email. All candidates will also be offered the opportunity to address those attending the opening ceremonies during the International Rally. Please email article and photo to kountryklub@newmarcorp.com by March 1st to be included in the April issue. If for some reason a candidate is unable to attend the International Rally, they may designate someone to read their comments to the membership.

The voting will be done by secret ballot during the Kountry Klub Business Meeting held during the International Rally. If you do not plan on attending the International Rally, and wish to vote, you may request a ballot from the Kountry Klub office. This must be done in writing or by email. Ballots must be returned to the Klub office no later than June 28, 2024. The unopened ballots will be securely kept and taken to the International Rally where the votes will be counted by those appointed. The Members-at-Large will be determined by the candidate receiving the most votes on the first ballot.

As a member of the Board of Directors, you will be working closely with the International Directors, the Klub office staff, Region Directors and other Board Members. You should be available to travel and attend Board Meetings as necessary. You should have a good understanding of the Mission and Goals of the Newmar Kountry Klub and a good understanding of how the Klub functions. You should be a good public relations person with good oral, computer and written communication skills. You will write articles for the *Legacy* magazine. In addition, you will answer any inquiries you receive from the general membership. You are responsible for reporting membership information, ideas and concerns as well as suggested recommendations for review by the Board of Directors.

Benefits: You will be reimbursed for Klub related office expenses, Board Meeting travel and rallies and special Klub functions you attend on behalf of the Kountry Klub. This issue is filled with all sorts of information on the upcoming International Rally in Pueblo. This is shaping up to be a great event, with a few new twists and options for our members this year. We hope you are able to join us in Pueblo, Colorado at the Colorado State Fairgrounds. Rally dates are July 27-August 3. There are a few ideas still in the making, so watch future issues of the *Legacy* as well as the monthly *Happenings* emails.

We have made a slight change that you will notice in this issue, we have deleted the mail in reservation form. This event will be processed as we do all of our special events, by online registration only. If you don't usually register online, it is very easy and secure to do. Go to our website newmarkountryklub.com, then click on Klub Calendar. You can either click the banner photo for the rally or in the dropdown box choose 38th International Rally Pueblo, CO. Once you click on that you will see the description of the rally, details on tours, etc., keep on scrolling down and you will come to the registration page. It is pretty easy; you just need to fill in the blanks. Information you will need when registering would be general contact information, your unit length, year, model (Bay Star, Dutch Star, Mountain Aire etc.) floor plan number, and either your 6-digit coach number or the last 5 of your VIN. Once you complete all questions it will bring you to the secure payment section add your credit card information and hit submit. Once it is submitted, you will receive an automated email confirmation. We will then process and send out your rally paperwork by mail usually within two weeks. If you have any questions, please email us kountryklub@newmarcorp.com, or give us a call 877-639-5582.

Due to some length constraints of sites, our parking team will do it's best to have all caravans and groups of members requested to be able to park together. However, in some cases, they may be somewhat separated.

We want to say goodbye to Dave & Joanne Killey, our Region 9 Directors as they are retiring. BACON-TOPPED MEXICAN CORN BREAD

Paul Bigler (26288)

Makes 8 servings using 1 large (12") cast iron skillet

Ingredients:

- 5-6 slices bacon (or more to your liking)
- 2 boxes JIFFY brand Corn Muffin Mix per Corn Muffin recipe:
- 2 eggs
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1 can (8.5 oz.) cream-style corn
- 2 jalapenos, chopped finely (vein and seeds removed for less heat)
- 2 cups shredded Mexican style cheese

Directions:

Heat oven to 350° F

Lightly spray skillet with non-stick oil spray.
Place 5 slices of bacon in the bottom of a cold skillet, criss-crossed/woven and UP THE SIDES OF THE PAN.
Put skillet in the oven, Cook until bacon starts cooking/forming

Put skillet in the oven, Cook until bacon starts cooking/forming grease.

In a large bowl, mix the cornbread batter, add the cream style corn, jalapenos, and then gently mix in the cheese.

Remove skillet from oven, (Do not remove the bacon.)

Carefully pour batter into the skillet, over the bacon.

Bake for 45 minutes.

Bread is done when toothpick comes out *mostly* clean... Allow to cool for 10-15 minutes then run a spatula around/under the edges of skillet to loosen the bread.

Flip the bread onto a plate, admire, cut with serrated knife and serve.

EASY, EASY, COBBLER

Cyndi & Gary Keefer (22848)

Ingredients:

- 1 stick butter
- 1 c sugar (or Splenda)
- 1-1/2 c flour (self-rising)
- 1-1/2 c milk
- 1 large can (16 oz.) peaches, drained OR 2 (16 oz.) cans cherry pie filling

Directions:

Melt butter in hot oven in 9 x 13 pan Mix dry ingredients well Add milk to dry ingredients and stir Pour into 9 x 13 with melted butter Add fruit on top

Bake at 400 for 30-40 minutes or until brown.

NOTES: If using a disposable foil pan, put on cookie sheet for support. If using peaches, add some of the juice into the dry ingredients when adding the milk, cutting back on the milk

2024 INTERNATIONAL Rally Information

REGISTRATION

This year we will have 50-amp FHU and 50-amp Electric and Water sites which will include one pump`

FRIENDS/FAMILY IN OTHER BRAND UNITS

As of May 21, 2024, family/friend guest units (non-Newmar) can register for the rally. They would register through our website site as you did. In the Klub Number field, they should enter "Guest" and in the comment section they should add "Guest of (and your name)". Be sure they register for same arrival day and time as you.

BOONDOCKING

We will be offering one night of boondocking (no power or hookups) on Thursday, July 25 for those with Friday arrivals and on Friday, July 26 for members with Saturday arrival dates. Cost for boondocking will be \$10 cash and collected upon arrival. Arrival times for boondocking would be 4-6 pm. No Earlier. If you plan to boondock, please indicate that on your reservation form for pre-planning purposes. Please be sure to follow the directions within your rally packet for boondock parking and posted signs.

HANDICAP MEMBERS

If you applied for handicap parking, we require a copy of your mirror hang tag or photo of license plate sent or emailed to us to complete your reservation. If you are in a wheelchair accessible unit, please indicate this on the registration form so we can ensure you have the added space needed.

RALLY CONFIRMATION PACKET

Within approximately two weeks of registering, you will receive a confirmation packet in the mail. Included in the packet is your color-coded parking card, directions/general information, and a yellow envelope with the service request form. If not received or lost, please email, or call the Klub office and we will send out a new packet as this parking card must be in your windshield when arriving.

PARKING/LATE ARRIVAL

Please have your color-coded parking card and Klub number decal displayed in your windshield upon arrival to help the parkers get you staged. Units with trailers or dollies attached will need to go through the staging lot, then funnel to the trailer and dolly storage area where you will unhook, leave the trailer or dolly behind, and then be instructed to your parking site.

Note: If you arrive after 4:00 pm you will be held in the staging area and parked the next morning.

EXTRA HOSES, CORDS AND LEVELING MATERIAL NEEDED

The sewer, water and electric hookups may be a distance from your unit. Be sure to have extra hoses and electric cords. Another item to note is that although many sites are quite level, some will require material to assure a comfortable, level site.

SERVICE AT INTERNATIONAL RALLY

Within your reservation packet you will receive a Service Request form in a yellow envelope. Be sure to fill out the form and return to the service department as soon as possible and before their deadline date. If you do not have time to mail by that date, bring paperwork to the rally and you will be processed as non-registered.

The service department once again wants to emphasize the benefits and importance of preregistering. Pre-registering often allows the techs to bring your needed parts to the rally.

In order to service as many customers as possible during the rally, the Service Department will prioritize their service in the following sequence:

- Emergency customers will be serviced first. Emergency items are ONLY items that would prevent a coach from leaving the rally or render a coach uninhabitable.
- Warranty customers will be serviced in order of date of purchase, beginning with the most recent.
- Out-of-warranty customers will also be serviced in order of date of purchase, beginning with the most recent. Newmar will offer this service at a reduced service rate plus reduced cost of parts.

PARTS DEPARTMENT

The Parts Department will bring an inventory of the more popular parts for you to purchase during the rally. Remember, if they do not have the part at the rally, you can order it for later delivery.

RALLY AREA TOURS

This year we will be offering several optional area tours, adventures, and special charity fund raising related dining options. If you register for any tours scheduled for Saturday, July 27th you will need to register to arrive on Friday as buses will be leaving before parking begins on Saturday. These tours are limited to bus capacity so be sure to book while registering for the rally to avoid disappointment if the tour selling out.

Important Note: We will have a First Time Attendee meeting on Sunday, July 28th. If this is your first International Rally, we strongly encourage you to attend this meeting and choose the tours offered on alternative dates.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR THE RALLY

In the registration area at the rally there will be tables set up with information on volunteer opportunities at the rally. Please be sure to stop by and schedule a time to help in your desired area.

RECEIVING MAIL AT THE RALLY

You can have mail sent to you during the rally. Please use this address for any mail or packages: your name and Klub #, Newmar Kountry Klub Rally, c/o Colorado State Fairgrounds, 1001 Beulah Ave, Pueblo, CO 81004. Mail should not be delivered before July 24th. Any items unclaimed or received after the rally will be returned to sender.

PHONE APP/POSTING OF RALLY PROGRAM

We will once again be using the phone app *GRUPIO* for your ease of viewing the rally schedule and have access to up to the minute changes. We anticipate the app will be available in early July if you would like to use for access to the schedule or view the Rally Program on our website. See future issues for information on the Grupio App, details on downloading, and in app changes for your use.

Come with us and explore one of America's tallest icons on a unique 9 mile cog rail ride to the top of this 14,115-foot granite national historic landmark. Along the way, you'll pass the way of the early explorers, passing Ruxton Creek, Diamond Rock, between the sheer rock walls of Englemann Canyon, waterfalls, and Deer Park. The railway continues up Son of a Gun Hill, into the Icebox (a cool shaded canyon), and past the remains of the Halfway House Hotel. Don't forget your camera to take that special snap of the local fauna or the magnificent vistas you'll see along the way. When you get to the top, take a few deep breaths as you view an endless horizon towards the Collegiate and Sangre de Christo ranges and the mining town of Cripple Creek.

Once we return to the base of Pikes Peak, we will board our motorcoach for a sumptuous lunch, and a docent guided tour of the Garden of the Gods. These magnificent rock formations are composed mostly of Lyons formations, a type of stone formed from fine sand and sedimentary rock of ancient sand dunes. The ice age of the Pleistocene epoch (2.6 million to 11,700 years ago) caused the erosion and glaciation we see as red rocks today.

This state of the art 60,000 square foot museum took 3 years to build at a cost of about \$91 million, the design inspired partly by the famous Sydney Opera House. One of the numerous galleries displays the torches from games dating back to 1936. Want to know how you compare to an Olympic / Paralympic class athlete? Try your hand at one of the six interactive activities, like a track for the 30-meter dash.

The museum's high tech visitor credential system uses RFID chips to accommodate guest's pre-registered special needs such as vision impairment, by increasing print size on the display graphics as the guest approaches. Or what if you want to follow a particular athlete, with this pre-registered request, the RFID chip will trigger as you enter a gallery to focus on the selected athlete. The "lab" gallery demonstrates the science and technology behind limb prosthetics as well as how an athlete's performance is effected by performance enhancing drugs.




NEW MEXICO

My wife, Renee and I bought our Kountry Star 4037DP in September 2022. We then joined the NKK and attended our first Rally in Sedalia. There, we witnessed for ourselves others who have also been "blessed" with good fortune, happiness, contentment, and pleasure.



In the fall of 2017, Renee and I drove to Bowling Green, KY. to get

away from our business for a few days of strategic planning and goal setting. While in Bowling Green we decided to visit the National Corvette Museum. The Corvette bug bit me and I knew that I just had to have one! We soon bought a new Corvette Grand Sport.

One of the members in our Corvette club asked if we would consider going on the "St Jude Corvette Drive". I didn't even know there was such a thing. Good, but still not good enough.

We knew then that we had to get involved. We discovered, there is never a charge for treatment, travel, housing, or food and that no family EVER receives a bill from St Jude. They all smile with eyes bright as they feel the thunder of over 100 Corvette engines rumbling by.

One little boy last year cried out, "momma, can I sit in one"? Arrangements were made for that little boy to (safely) sit behind the wheel of his chosen Corvette. He pushed the ignition button, and that big Corvette engine came to life! Can you imagine his smile? A dry eye could not be found.

We do the Corvette Drive to help the kids of St Jude get well. We keep going back year after year because it means so much to St Jude kids and to us! We're pleased to share with you the **Newmar Kountry Klub Code of Conduct (see below)** which has been approved by the Newmar Kountry Klub Board of Directors. This has been created by looking across other organizations, and in close collaboration with the Members-at-Large, Debbie & Evan Hughes, the past International Directors, Ron & Wanda Llewellyn, and the executives and professional staff at Newmar Corporation.

These descriptions of conduct are straightforward and will now be included in our standard practice of organizing and hosting activities. We've also included generally accepted RV Lifestyle expected behaviors so well-articulated by the Escapees RV Club, of which we are also members. In special consideration of our Klub founding and legacy, **the Code of Conduct also has a Policy on Alcoholic Beverages (see below)**. The intent of the Code of Conduct is to set expectations of behavior between us and consequences of poor behavior, regardless of underlying cause.

We've noticed a wide range of interpretations of the Klub's policy regards alcoholic beverages and this policy is intended to remove differing interpretations as an issue of possible contention and disruption of good-will and harmony.

As always, we welcome your comments and questions. In the words of past International Directors Bob & Bonner Krieger, "Let's Rally On!"

CODE OF CONDUCT

The purpose of the Newmar Kountry Klub is to provide the confidence and peace of mind that empowers our members to fulfill their hopes and dreams for adventure while making memories with lifelong friends – the Newmar RV Lifestyle.

Newmar Kountry Klub (herein referred to as the "Klub") members are expected to conduct themselves respectfully and with consideration for others. A member's character and actions reflect the Klub's reputation. A member shall not behave in a manner that adversely affects the reputation of the Klub. To help prevent and manage conflicts, we have a Code of Conduct for our members. Members may be subject to suspension or termination of membership for any of, but not limited to, the following reasons.

- Discrimination is not acceptable and will not be tolerated. This includes discrimination based on sex, race, color, nationality, ethnicity or national origin, ancestry, citizenship, religion or belief, age, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sexual orientation, veteran status, marital status, genetic information, or characteristics.
- Members are expected to refrain from displays of aggressive, violent or abusive behavior, and to maintain control of their temper when around other members, guests, and staff at any event. This also applies in our Klub-managed online platforms, including our discussion forums and our social media profiles and groups.
- Members are expected to refrain from language or behavior that is unsolicited, unwanted, and deemed harassment of a member, guest, or staff of the Klub, or at any Klub event.
- Members are to refrain from delinquency, nonpayment of fees, dues, charges, or other financial obligations owed to the Klub or Chapters. Nonpayment of fees includes unpaid returned-check charges and bank processing fees that are not remitted upon request.
- Members are expected to follow park rules and requests made by Klub or park staff while staying or participating at a park or at a Klub event. This includes those set by the organizers and the venue or property where the event is taking place. We strongly recommend that members review and adhere to the RV industry-sanctioned Good Neighbor Policy and the RVers Boondocking Policy.
- Members are expected to comply with all local, state, and federal guidelines, authorities, laws or rules of the location of the events including, but not limited to, health and emergency guidelines, local pet/leash laws, parking restrictions, trash disposal, and other ordinances.
- Members should not spread harmful, misleading, or defaming information about others, Newmar Kountry Klub, Newmar, or its suppliers, nor infringe upon their copyrights.
- Members should refrain from discussions regarding controversial topics during events, activities, functions, in facilities or online communication platforms and groups bearing the Klub name that may cause conflict with others. Our activities should remain respectful and welcoming.

• Out of respect for privacy, members are not permitted to use information associated with members for personal gain or in assisting in the commercial gain of others. In addition, members are not permitted to make promotional posts or send unsolicited messages to members of our social media pages or groups. This includes chain letters, multi-level marketing, advertising, and promoting other products or services.

Members or member-sponsored guests engaging in improper behavior may receive a warning from Klub activity organizers or leaders. If inappropriate behavior continues, the member or guest can be asked to leave the Klub activity and a flagged warning will be added to their account. Membership privileges can be suspended or terminated after due consideration by the International Directors.

The Board of Directors, in its sole discretion, will interpret what is a violation of this Code of Conduct. Should termination occur, there will be no refund of monies paid by the member to the Klub.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Our intent:

- Emphasize that no Kountry Klub or associated funds may purchase alcoholic beverages.
- The Kountry Klub may allow a licensed catering service or vendor to sell alcoholic beverages to individuals of legal age. An outside sponsor may contract with a licensed catering service or vendor to sell alcoholic beverages to individuals of legal age.
- As an individual, a member may socialize and provide hospitality that includes alcoholic beverages to other individuals who may also be a member, as is common with the RV Lifestyle.

NEWMAR KOUNTRY KLUB "BOARD OF DIRECTORS" POLICY ON ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

No Kountry Klub, Regional, Provincial, State, or Chapter funds collected or received will be expended on alcoholic beverages.

The Kountry Klub may allow a licensed catering service or vendor to sell alcoholic beverages to members of legal age, pursuant to venue policies.

For clarity, any personal consumption of alcoholic beverages, or any purchased or provided by an individual, is the personal responsibility and at the individual risk of said person or persons.

Regional Directors - Special Events Position

The position of Regional Directors - Special Events requires self-motivated, enthusiastic, and flexible team players. The Directors must be able to function independently within the context of the Klub strategy and guidelines and provide vision, leadership, planning, and organization to the event host team. Good communicative skills are essential, as is the ability to work collaboratively and harmoniously with others.

The Klub strives to provide Special Events that are unique opportunities for members to break the mold and fulfill dreams for travel adventures. Special Events can be coach-based and from a fixed location, coach-based while moving from location to location, or by traveling through other modes of transportation with fellow Kountry Klub members.

Regional Directors - Special Events must be members of the Kountry Klub in good standing and own a Newmar product. The position is open to a couple or individual. There is a minimum term limit of three years with the possibility of annual extensions at the discretion of the International Directors, with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Regional Directors - Special Events work closely with the International Directors, the Klub Coordinator, Home Office Staff, and other Directors. You will communicate and keep the Kountry Klub abreast of Special Event goals, development, and activities. Regional Directors - Special Events are responsible for ensuring that all activities are hosted and conducted in accordance with the Klub By-Laws and Code of Conduct.

Regional Directors - Special Events will receive reimbursement for Klub-related expenses and other Klub benefits. This is a challenging position, but one that can be rewarding.

Regional Directors - Special Events Duties

- 1. Schedule and populate the Special Events Calendar of Events. Special Events, pricing and scheduling is approved in conjunction with the International Directors.
- 2. Attend the International Rally each year. Supervise the Special Events and Tours in support of the International Rally experience for members and assist in other Director duties as assigned.
- 3. Attract, train, supervise and retain Special Event tour hosts. Ensure all Special Event Tour Hosts receive sufficient training, information, certification, and Klub materials to successfully lead a tour and fulfill their duties. Regional Directors Special Events are responsible for providing mentorship and insight to new Special Event Tour Hosts ensuring they understand the By-Laws, Guidelines, Directives and Code of Conduct of the Klub.
- 4. Assist your Special Event Hosts in organizing tours.
- 5. Receive and approve tour hosts expense reports and event evaluation sheets. You will provide timely updates of Special Event activities and will also provide an annual Special Events Income Statement Summary.
- 6. You will be reimbursed for Klub-related expenses. Regional Director Special Events are also eligible to fulfill the role of Special Event Host with its associated benefits.
- 7. Update and edit the "Calendar of Events" and articles for the Klub website, Legacy Magazine, and Happenings email newsletter. The "Calendar of Events" will be submitted to the Klub Office. The articles are sent to the Klub Coordinator
- 8. Write a "Special Events" news article for each issue of the Klub's magazine. Keep the Special Events webpage current.
- 9. Be a leader working together with tour hosts, Klub officers and Klub members. Have fun and be positive! Klub members serving as Regional Directors Special Events will receive the following benefits:

Regional Directors - Special Events Benefits

- 1. Membership in the Newmar Kountry Klub and subscription to the Legacy magazine will be provided while in office.
- 2. Title display sign for RV and Region Director Special Events name badges will be provided.
- 3. Reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of the Regional Directors Special Events duties.

In my last article, you may recall I asked everyone to STOP... as you pass through Kentucky and enjoy some of the beauty and fun our state has to offer. Now that you've received your February/March 2024 edition of the *Legacy* magazine... Snowbirds, it's time to start planning your trip back home.

How about a plan that looks like this: if you're traveling north into Kentucky on I75 you won't want to pass up the chance to visit Cumberland Falls State Park, also known as "The Niagara of the South". With exits between Williamsburg and Corbin, Cumberland Falls is very easy to get to and has plenty of campground opportunities and amenities. A visit to the area would not be complete without a stop at the original Kentucky Fried Chicken restaurant where Colonel Sanders perfected his "eleven herbs and spices" recipe. If you're not into fried chicken, one of our personal favorite restaurants is a little place in downtown Corbin, called Wrigley's. Their burgers and sandwiches are awesome, but be sure and order the Caramelized Brussel Sprouts, yum!!

About an hour's drive north of Corbin you'll want to visit Lexington where Keeneland Race Track and the Kentucky Horse Park is located. The world-famous Calumet Horse Farm is also located in Lexington, but so are many other notable horse farms. Malone's Steak House is a slam dunk for dinner!! Be sure and take a leisurely drive to Midway and Paris where many beautiful horse farms dot the bluegrass landscape... Honestly, they're just too beautiful to miss. Trust me, you won't regret your visit. From Lexington, if you're heading home toward Cincinnati make plans to stop just off I75 and visit the Ark Encounter in Williamstown, Kentucky. A little further north is the Newport Aquarium featuring thousands of exotic sea creatures.

If instead your road home, takes you north on I65... whatever you do don't miss the National Corvette Museum. You can camp on-site with full hookups and full amenities. Many will remember February 14th of 2014 when a massive sinkhole opened up inside the museum and swallowed eight very rare Corvettes landing 60' below in a massive sinkhole. The museum has done a superb job recreating the seismic

activity of the moment the sinkhole opened up. Many of the rare Corvettes have been restored and are again on display. Depending on when you visit you may also be able to tour the Corvette Assembly Plant right next door. Be sure to stop at Mammoth Cave. There are walking tours to fit everyone's abilities. Mammoth Cave National Park is the second oldest of all the national parks and features over 500 miles of unexplored subterranean beauty.

If your travels home take you through Nashville, and northwest on 124 don't miss the beautiful Land Between the Lakes National Recreation area in West Kentucky. It's huge and offers an abundance of campgrounds, hiking, horseback riding, fishing, woodlands and wildlife including an Elk and Bison Refuge. With over 300 miles of natural shoreline and over 172,000 acres, there's plenty of room for you to STOP... and play or rest a bit on your long journey home. Before you leave the area, visit the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky. If you're into quilts or quilt making, you won't want to miss it

Well, Snowbirds, there you have it. But this is just a fly on an elephant's posterior compared to all there is to see and do in Kentucky. Within two weeks of registering, you should be receiving your confirmation by postal mail. This will include the specific directions for arriving at the fairgrounds, color-coded parking pass, service request form and other pertinent information. Please make sure you arrive on your designated arrival date and parking time.

We will once again be offering boondocking one day prior to your designated arrival day. The cost will be \$10 cash and will be collected upon arrival. Please arrive for boondocking between 4pm & 6pm. No Earlier. You will be staged by parking times and unit length to be parked the next morning.

Please have your Klub number and color-coded parking card displayed in your windshield ahead of arrival. It is extremely important that both are easily seen upon arrival for the parking team. We appreciate your full cooperation to ensure the parking process flows smoothly. We not only use your Klub number for parking, but it also helps to locate you in case of emergencies, for the service techs, or any vendor installations.

It you tow a trailer or dolly you will need to unhook, and the trailer will be parked in a designated area.

We will 50-amp full hookup sites and 50-amp electric & water sites which will include one pumpout on a designated day. The amenities may be a slight distance from the units so please arrive with additional electric cords, water hoses and sewer connections. City water is available to all coaches. Some water hookups are shared and NOT designated for one unit. Remember to bring a "Y" so you can take water on as needed. Also, some sites may need a little blocking material to level your unit.

If you wish to park with a friend, you must have the same arrival date/time and arrive together. The parking team will do their best to park you together. Parking at the Colorado State Fairgrounds must comprehend unit length. Every effort will be made to keep your group together. Units of differing lengths may not be able to park in the same location. All caravans (4 or more units) must be pre-registered with the Klub Office as a caravan and arrive together at your designated time.

Anyone arriving after 4:00 PM on parking days will be held in the staging area and will be parked the next morning.

AWNING AND SLIDEOUT TOPPER OVERVIEW

This article provides a brief operational and maintenance overview of the awnings and slideout toppers.

Slideout Toppers

Slideout toppers operate as the slideouts are extended and retracted. Check the slideout topper for debris (leaves, branches, ice, snow, etc.) before retracting the slideout. If pooling has occurred after rain, one way to remove water on the slideout roof or topper is to tilt the coach using the leveling system to aid in water runoff.

A CAUTION

Slideout toppers should be retracted when snow, heavy rain, wind, and severe weather conditions are expected. Never leave slideout toppers open or unattended during severe weather and/or accumulating rain.

Awnings

Awnings are a standard feature on your coach. Newmar offers a variety of brands and types of awnings, depending on the year and model of your coach, as well as the available options that were selected when your coach was built.



Select models may feature entrance door, window awnings, and/or patio awnings. The patio awning is the larger-sized awning on the coach and is the main awning. These awnings connect at or near the roof, providing shade and light rain protection on the passenger side of the coach. Awnings with LED strips may also provide lighting when desired.

The powered patio, window, and door awnings (if equipped) on your coach can be operated with ease using the appropriate switch(es) to extend or retract the awnings as desired. The switch is typically located in the overhead control panel. If they are not at this location, check above the passenger window, as it may be hidden by the window shade. Some coach awnings may also operate via remote control or the SilverLeaf touchscreen (if equipped). For more information about your specific awnings, refer to the manufacturer's information in Newgle.

A IMPORTANT

Before extending any of your coach awnings, check for any obstructions that may prevent the awnings from deploying properly. Inspect the area around your coach where the awning will extend to ensure proper clearance. Check the awning for debris (leaves, branches, ice, snow, etc.) before retracting.

CAUTION

Awnings should be retracted during accumulating rains. Pooling water on the awning can result in damage to the awning hardware and/or fabric.

A CAUTION

Awnings should be retracted when snow, heavy rain, wind, and severe weather conditions are expected. Never leave awnings open or unattended during severe weather and/or accumulating rain.

HOW TO REMOVE A LIVING ROOM OR BEDROOM TELEVISION ON A STATIONARY OR SWING ARM MOUNT

This article provides general information about how televisions installed on a stationary or swing arm wall mount can be removed. These are typically located in the bedroom or living room and are not installed on a televator lift.

Swing Arm Bracket



For televisions mounted on a swing arm bracket, pull the TV away from the wall to gain access to the bolts or screws holding the bracket to the back of the television. Remove the attaching bolts.


Stationary Bracket

For stationary-mounted televisions, look closely with a light. Most of the stationary TVs are mounted to a bracket, which is screwed to the wall. You may have to use short bits in a ratchet or similar device to remove the screws from the bracket to the wall. Some older models may have a two-piece bracket with removable nut(s) at the bottom. Once the nuts are removed, the TV may be lifted up and off of the other bracket and pulled away from the wall.




